

## Cow Pattern Instructions for Elizabeth

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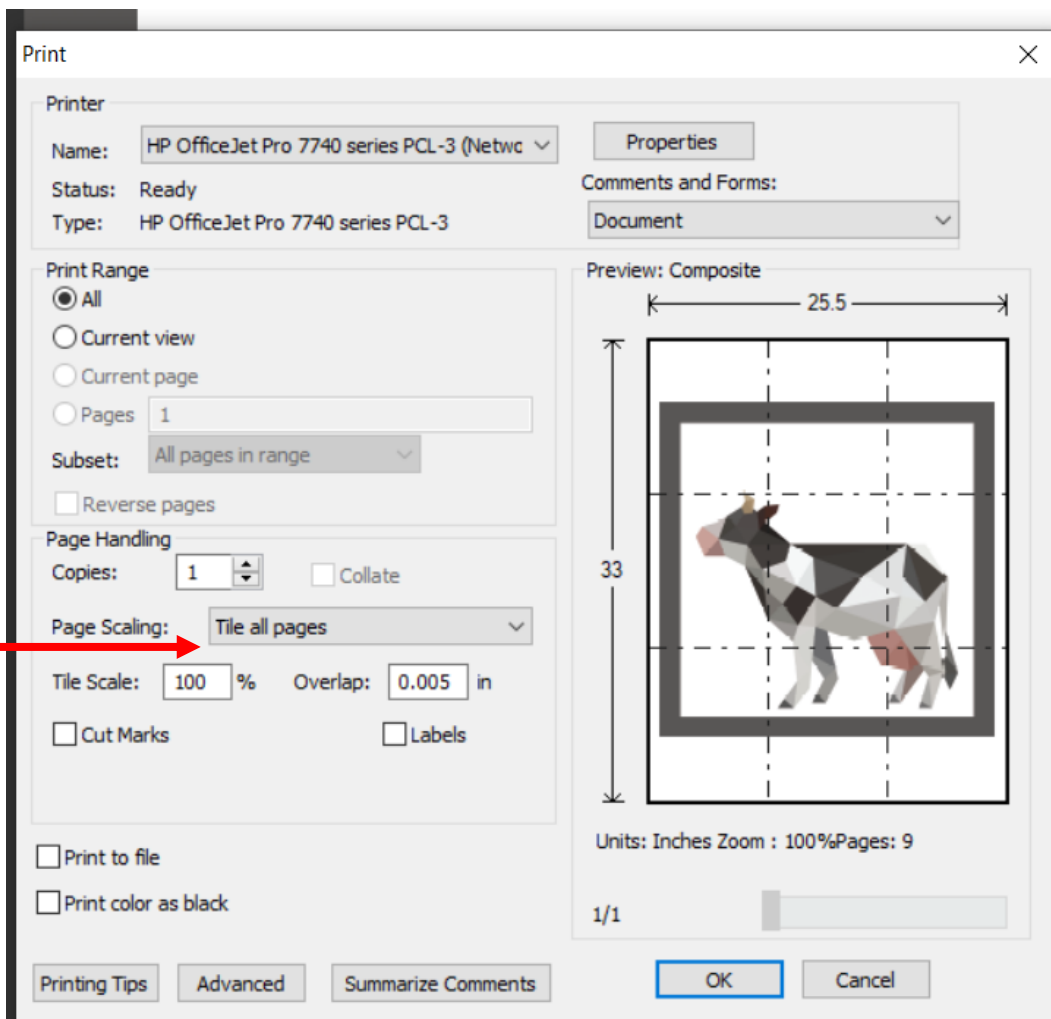
Cow Pattern PDF is 24x24 inches with a 1.5x1.5 border.

Follow these instructions to print and draw the pattern.

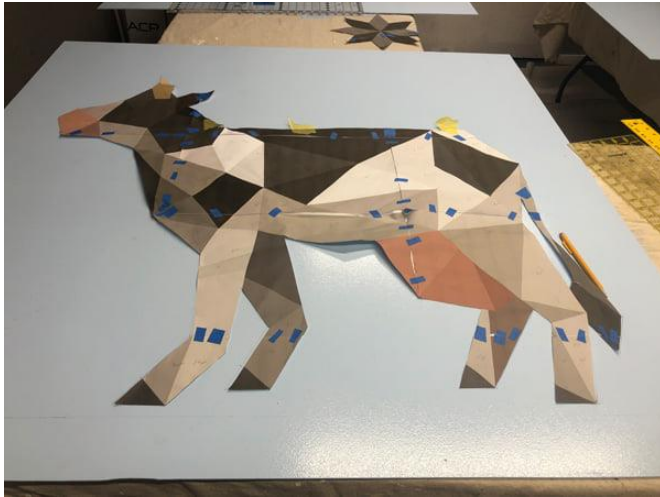
1. Open PDF
2. Select File>Print

The print option open and will look something like this below.

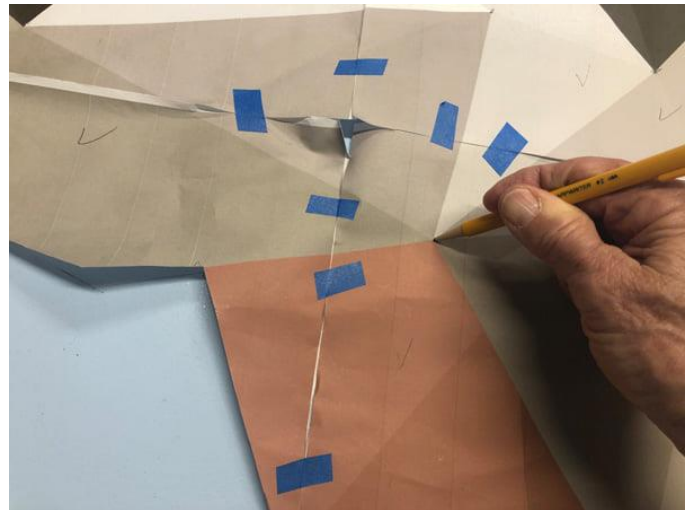
- a. Select Properties>Paper size (Mine was set to 8.5 x 11)
  - b. Select Page Scaling: Tile all pages. This will print the cow as show below, on 9 sheets of 8.5 x 11.
3. After the pages print, cut out the cow and tape it together, matching the geometric shapes.  
There is no need to cut out the border. That was only included to scale the cow to fit.  
Go to next page for drawing instructions.



4. After priming your barn quilt board, Draw your Border first.
5. Position the cow within your border and apply a few pieces of frog tape to keep it in place.
6. Trace around the cow with pencil.



7. Use your pencil to poke a hole through the pattern at the junction points of the geometric designs and draw a dot.



8. Lift the pattern and connect the dots drawing a line between them with a ruler. Continue lifting the pattern to make sure you're on track until you have all the pieces drawn.
9. Once you have the pattern drawn, it's helpful to keep it nearby so you can match your colors.
