

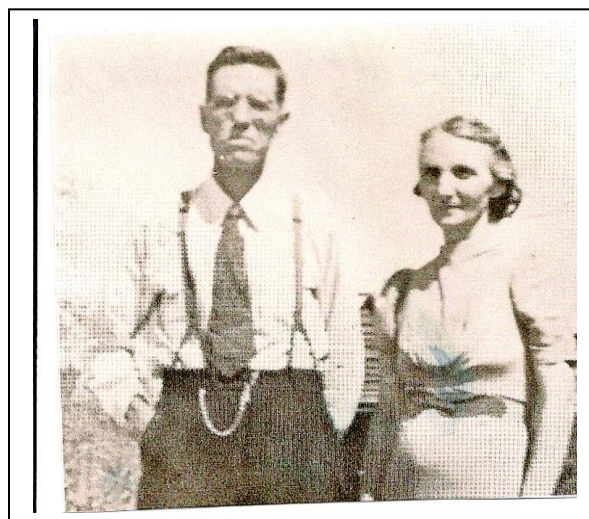
History of Sardis Baptist Church

Sardis Baptist Church was established in 1875. As the area six miles west of Palmetto became more populated, residents felt the need of a more localized church. In 1875 the "Baptist Church of Christ at Sardis" was established with the Reverend J.R.T. Brown as pastor. Earliest membership records show 65 members on role (see below). Many came from Ramah Baptist Church in Palmetto. The first church building was located on the southeast corner of the intersection of Hutcheson Ferry and Sardis Roads. Services were held one weekend each month (Saturday and Sunday). An enlargement to the first church was added in 1904.

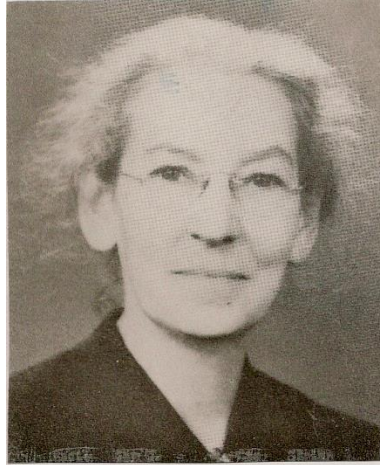
In October, 1926, a committee was appointed by the church to investigate building a new church. The committee members included: H.G. Peek, C.D. Kearns, F.O. Turner, D.B. Gullatt, Mrs. Mamie Barnes, and Mrs. Mamie Turner.

In November of 1926, the church voted 23 to 13 in favor of building a new church building. Many thought it would be impossible, that they would never be able to pay for

a new building. One man said, “The only way we can pay for a new church would be to sell the cemetery.” But there were others who knew that with God’s help they could do it. Mr. Henry Peek said that he would be at the church on Monday morning to start building and that anyone who wished to help would be welcome to join him. Many men met together and the building was started. When the building was completed in 1928, the entire structure was paid for with the exception of the new pews, for which Mrs. Mamie Barnes loaned the money. The church still meets in the same building today.

In 1935 services were changed to two Sundays each month. Records show that in 1942 the church was called “Sardis Baptist Church”. Some members recall that as late as 1947 horses and wagons were still used by some people as a means of transportation to church. The church began holding services every Sunday in 1948.

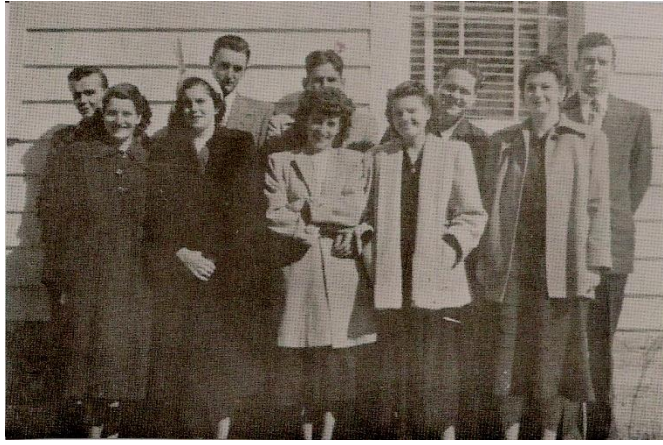
Sunday School rooms were added to the church in 1944 and again in 1947. A Sunday School building was added in 1960 and an Education Building was added in 1980.



Sunday School Building



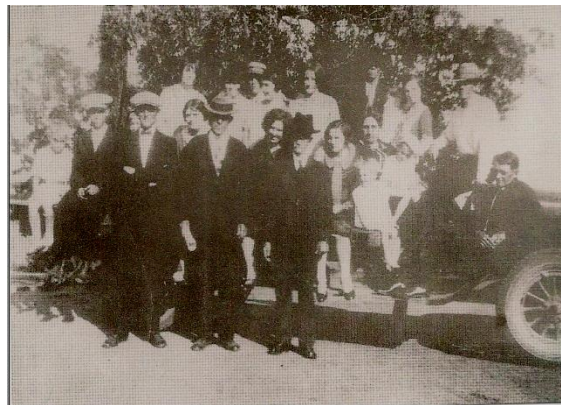
Education Building

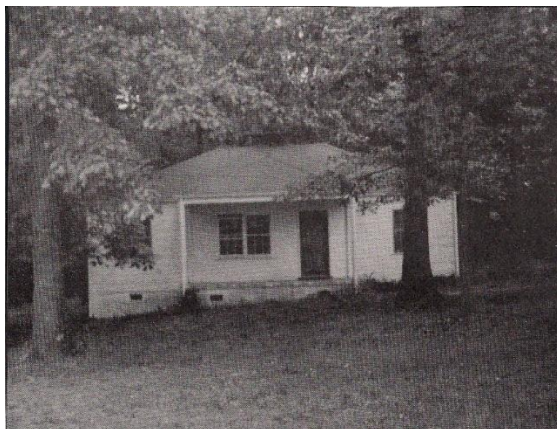


The Gospel Wagon

In June of 1954 the church voted to build a Pastorium, which was first occupied by Rev. J.O. Strickland. This building is located, across Hutcheson Ferry Road from the church

building, on Vernon Grove Road. In 1966 a larger pastorium, first occupied by Rev. Bill Anglin, was built where the original church had been located and the old pastorium became Sunday School rooms.



In June 1954 the church voted to build a Pastorium, which was first occupied by Rev. J.O. Strickland.



**In April 1966 plans for the new Pastorium were presented to the church.
In June 1966 the pastorium was ready for occupancy. Rev. Bill Anglin moved in.
In January 1967 Open House was held in the new pastorium.**

In 1998 the church grounds underwent a facelift including new landscaping, church sign, and outside lights.

The summer of 2008, a community pavilion was completed. The pavilion was made available for use by any residents of the community for activities such as picnics, family reunions, and birthday/anniversary celebrations.

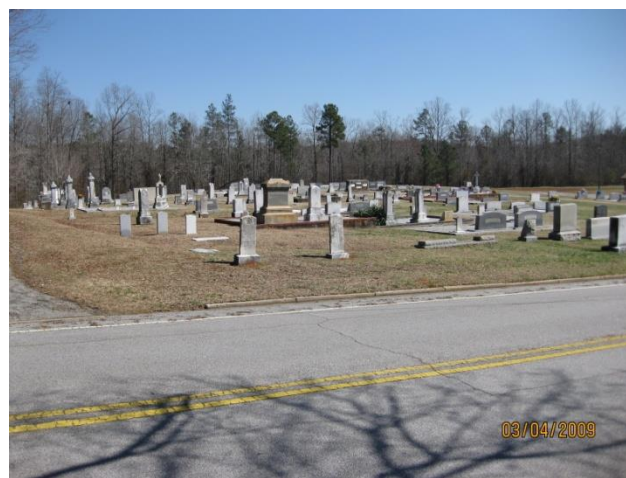

The Sardis Baptist Church Cemetery is located on Sardis Church Road behind the location of the original church building (now the site of the pastorium). There are approximately 275 graves, 28 of which are unmarked (10 unknown). There are 23 marked soldier's graves: 2 - U.S. Army, 3 - World War I, 7 - World War II, 10 - Confederate Army, 1 - Vietnam War.

The earliest birth date of the recorded markers is 1811, Martha Thompson, a charter member.

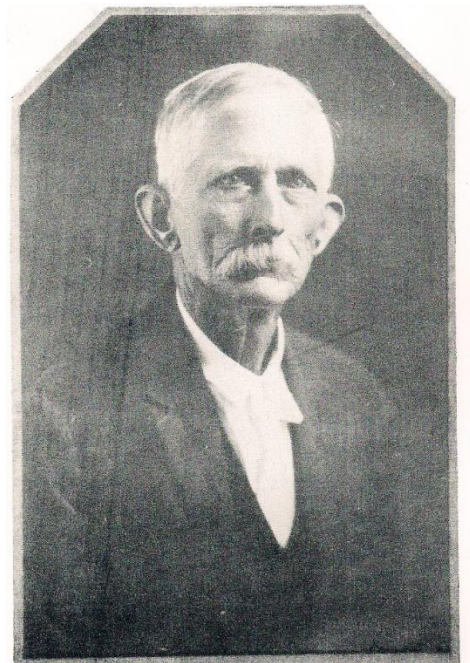

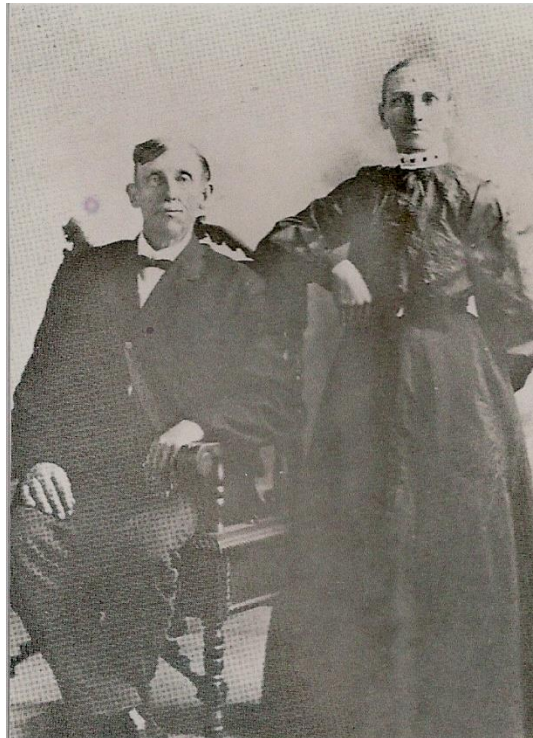

Facts of Interest

- **On February 23, 1889 the church voted that each member would give a nickel each month during that year.**
- **On January 25, 1889 the church employed Sister Samantha Thompson to keep the church clean for \$5.00 per year.**
- **On April, 1902 the church adopted the rule of monthly contributions. They collected 85 cents.**
- **In March, 1905 no church conference was held because of rainy weather.**
- **On August 31, 1935 Mr. S.H. Hearn was elected church treasurer. This is the first time a church treasurer was mentioned in minutes.**
- **On November 2, 1935 the vote was taken by the church on whether to continue to meet on Saturday and Sunday or two Sundays a month.**
- **On September 4, 1937 the church voted to buy a communion set.**
- **From the years 1875 - 1942 Sardis was called "Baptist Church of Christ at Sardis". On March 15, 1942 were the first records of being called "Sardis Baptist Church".**
- **In September 1948 it was voted to go to full time preaching services.**
